RELIGION

To begin the term, we will continue to explore the sacraments in our unit titled, 'Sacred Actions can be a powerful form of Communication of God's presence'. Students will continue learning about the sacraments of initiation and how these are a sign of God's love for us.

Following this unit, we will explore our final learning sequence of the year, titled 'Inspirational People of Faith are Honoured and Recognised in their Communities'. Students will use their prior understanding of communities to delve deeper into the role that Mother Mary played in her community and her role in the world today. We will examine the Hail Mary prayer as well as analyse Bible stories that include Mary in them.

ENGLISH

Our English program in Term 4 will cover learning trigraphs, digraphs, prefixes and suffixes, reading multisyllable words, and more. We will also engage in book studies using the books 'Where the Forest Meets the Sea' by Jeanie Baker, 'Looking after Country' by Victor Steffensen, 'The Imagineer' by Christopher Cheng and 'Wilfred Gordon McDonald Patridge' by Mem Fox. These book studies will tie into our writing lessons, with a focus on sentence level writing which will develop into narratives.

MATHEMATICS

Students will continue to be guided through Math lessons using the Ochre program. These lessons will build on previously taught content and skills from term 3, progressively becoming more challenging.

They will engage in regular lessons on Number and Algebra, as well as Geometry and Statistics. Each day, students will be led by their teacher in

a 'daily review' where previously taught content is reviewed in a fun, fast paced style, developing fluency and confidence. Students will also have regular opportunities to extend their knowledge and Maths skills through open-ended questions and extension tasks to deepen their learning. We will also engage the students in our Rocket Maths program which is based on students' quick recall of addition and subtraction facts.

SCIENCE

In Science this term we are learning about living things, what they need to survive, and their habitats. Students will focus on the structure, function, growth, and development of plants and animals and how plants and animals process information.

HEALTH

Our Health Program will continue to involve the Resilience Project, and will include concepts like naming our emotions, being grateful for our local heroes, and healthy lifestyles. We will also be learning about protective behaviours using the Daniel Morcombe Foundation resources.

HASS

Our HASS topic is world geography learning all about the countries around the world. Students will learn places and regions have certain characteristics that distinguish them from other areas. These characteristics are physical—landforms, climate, and vegetation; and human—population and culture.
